Everything Beautiful Thrift Store E'mapeva'e Netaa'o Hovea'

200 E. Medicine Lodge Drive Lame Deer, Montana (open T-W-Th--12 to 6 PM)

This store opened in May 2012 and is serving the needs of the people on the Cheyenne Reservation. This thrift store is the beginning of community outreach projects that were the vision of the Northern Cheyenne Ministerial Association. This non-profit organization (NCMA) received a grant to upgrade the old Baptist school where the store is temporarily located. Suzette Cain, the business manager, is excited about the number of people visiting the store and the opportunities she has to touch the lives of those who have a specific need. Often, if a person has a concern, the Lord provides a quiet time when there is no one in the store and she is able to listen and pray with them. To enhance her opportunity to witness there are free Bibles and pamphlets available.

Suzette has the help of three seventh grade girls who stop to volunteer after school which gives them something to do as well as experience in business skills and customer relations.

There are two organizations who send people to this thrift shop if they have a need for clothing following a health procedure. Clothing is given to people sent by Healing Hearts or a Community Health Representative.

Many of the items in the store have been given by members of congregations across Montana. Suzette says that small household items like towels, dishes, bedding, small appliances and anything educational would be welcome additions to the inventory.

A fund has been started for a new building since this old one has major repair needs. Suzette is collecting change from people who shop at the store to apply toward the new building. She is committed to this venture in Lame Deer. Suzette is a member of Circle of Life Lutheran Church in Muddy Cluster where she works with the youth.

So people must travel to Hardin, Billings, or Sheridan for care. That requires gasoline many can't afford. And deaths have been numerous since September. All the old problems that lead to death are still common. The economic and health care issues complicate lives. It can be quite discouraging.

Weather (bad roads and cold) and sickness have impacted church attendance in a negative way. Some Sundays only one person attends. So the Word and Sacraments carry on no matter how the enemy tries to stop us.

And the Lord is faithful. He does provide. The Sunday schoolers come steadily. The youth group finds the Bible interesting and exciting, so they invite friends. The confirmands press on in their studies even when tired.

Also the Lord is using the hardships to awaken some people. Some who have become lost in very dark places are coming into the Light.

A man in his late 20's is growing well. He's not only the spiritual head in his household, but is also seeking to lead his extended family into the Light. The enemy continues to battle him, but he stands his ground in the strength of the Lord by the sword of the Spirit, God's Word.

The Lord also provides some surplus in material things like food, money, blankets and warm clothes so we can share with one another. Thus we can help shoulder each others burdens. 
Prayers


