To Reaffirm the Biblical Practice of Gathered Local Congregations with 1 Rightly Called Local Pastors and To encourage congregations to practice in-2 person worship, teaching, and administration of the sacraments 3 **Resolution 3-02** 4 WHEREAS, The churches of the Lutheran Confession have consistently 5 maintained membership rosters for the sake of good order and pastoral care; and 6 7 WHEREAS, Local congregations have long striven to work with one another fraternally and for the sake of good order in regard to transfers and changes in 8 membership, as well as honoring church discipline when such has been necessary; 9 and 10 WHEREAS, Pastors are instructed to "shepherd the flock of God that is among 11 you, exercising oversight," (1 Peter 5:2, italics added) and they have vowed to 12 "perform the functions of a pastor in an evangelical manner; to aid, counsel, and 13 guide members of all ages and social conditions; to visit the sick and the dying; to 14 admonish the indifferent and the erring," 1; and 15 WHEREAS, A pastor, who is not physically among his people, is not able to 16 shepherd the flock by visiting the sick and the dying or to exercise oversight or to 17 administer the sacraments in person; and 18 WHEREAS, The emerging practice of congregations seeking and receiving as 19 members those who are geographically distant, especially when there is a local 20 congregation near such individuals, creates confusion and division in 21 congregations, circuits, and districts while generating many questions about 22 pastoral oversight and visitation, care at the time of death, and Christian burial, 23 etc.; and 24 WHEREAS, There are already a number of "churches" in the quickly expanding 25 online world of remote pastors who teach and guide virtual members; and 26 WHEREAS, A growing number of Christians are choosing to join virtual 27 churches and participate exclusively online, and our Lutheran congregations are 28 not immune from this temptation to abandon the traditional gathered body of 29 believers as recorded in Acts 1:12-14; and 30 WHEREAS, The writer to the Hebrews teaches, "let us consider how to stir up 31 one another to love and good works, not neglecting to meet together, as is the habit 32

33 34	of some, but encouraging one another, and all the more as you see the Day drawing near," (Hebrews 10:24-25); therefore be it
35 36 37 38	Resolved, That the Pastors and congregations of the Montana District of the LCMS be encouraged to study God's Word and our Lutheran Confessions to be reminded what it means to be a Christian congregation and a member of the body of Christ; and be it further
39 40 41	<i>Resolved</i> , That the congregations of the Montana District of the LCMS, be encouraged to limit online worship, except in exigent situations when attendance is not possible; and be it further
42 43 44	Resolved, That congregations of the Montana District of the LCMS be discouraged from practicing remote membership and virtual congregations; and be it further
45 46 47	<i>Resolved</i> , That the congregations of the Montana District of the LCMS, be encouraged to teach our members the specific dangers of remote and virtual worship attendance; and be it finally
48 49	<i>Resolved</i> , That this resolution be forwarded to The Lutheran Church—Missouri Synod for adoption at its 2023 convention.
